Dear Student, Parent and Carer,

School Re-opening

Following the government announcement this week about likelihood of schools re-opening on the 1st June 2020, we felt it essential that we provide further information.

As the government has stated, the return will be phased with Year 1 and Year 6 being the first to return after half term. We want to assure you that we have been working on detailed plans for several weeks now. It is very clear that to prioritise health and safety at all times for both students and staff the return will need to be tightly controlled and phased. Once the plan has been finalised, we will be in touch to give all students, parents and carers more detail.

Health and Safety of both students and staff will be our number one focus to ensure that everyone is safe whilst on site. As a consequence of this, certain rules will be necessary, which must be followed at all times. As a school and parents, we need to work together to ensure all the children are aware that if these rules are broken a child will be asked to remain at home until we can be confident their return to school does not compromise the safety of all. These rules include:

- All children will have their temperature taken as they arrive to school. If they refuse or their temperature is deemed as high, they will be sent home immediately. If you are not happy for them to be sent home or you are unable to collect them if the school calls you, then do not send them into school during the phased return.
- Social distancing will be expected to be followed at all times and if a student breaches this continuously then they will be sent home. They will remain at home until such time as we can be confident they are able to manage their conduct appropriately.
- There will be stringent rules regarding hand washing throughout the day.
- PPE maybe worn by staff but we will not be providing any for students at this point.
- If a student needs to be positively handled then they will be sent home. They will then follow virtual learning for a significant period of time.
